13. DEFECTS, BREAKDOWNS AND REPAIRS

No major breakdown was occurred during 21.47 h of field operation.

14. SUMMARY OF OBSERVATIONS, COMMENTS & RECOMMENDATIONS

14.1 Performance of brush cutter with Nylon rope

14.1.1 Rate of work

- a) The rate of work was recorded as 0.047 to 0.079 ha/h with operation speed 0.25 to 0.36 kmph.
- b) The time required to cover one hectare was recorded as 12.67 to 21.51 hours.

14.1.2 Quality of work

Mass of weed cut was observed as 65 to 78 kg/h.

14.1.3 Fuel consumption

Fuel consumption was observed as 0.88 to 0.90 l/h and 11.15 to 19.36 l/ha.

14.2 Performance of brush cutter with 2-T blade

14.2.1 Rate of work

- a) The rate of work was recorded as 0.020 to 0.041 ha /h with operation speed of 0.12 to 0.28 kmph.
- b) The time required to cover one hectare was recorded as 24.21 to 49.32 h.

14.2.2 Quality of work

Mass of weed cut was observed as 25 to 163 kg/h.

14.2.3 Fuel consumption

Fuel consumption was observed as 0.81 to 0.98 l/h and 19.71 to 48.33 l/ha.

14.3 Labour requirement

An averagely built person can able to operate the brush cutter for thirty minutes at a stretch. Hence, two operators are required for continuous operation.

- Noise at operator's ear level and bystander's level was observed on higher side against danger limits of 90 db(A) as specified by ILO for continuous exposure of 8 hours per day. This calls for reduction in noise level to improve the operational comfort and safety.
- 14.5 The Amplitude of mechanical vibration at various assemblies marked with *in **Table no. 1** is on higher side. This calls for dampening down of vibration to improve the operational comfort and service life of the components.
- During testing, Goggles and Earmuffs was provided as protective devices. All the necessary protective accessories, as mentioned in the instruction manual, like arm cover, gloves, leg protector, face shield, helmet, etc. was not provided. All these should necessarily be provided for the safety of operator.
- 14.7 No labeling plate indicating Year of manufacture, Power of prime mover, Specific fuel consumption, Rated speed of engine, Speed of cutting attachment, etc. has been provided on the machine. This may be looked into for necessary corrective action.
